STRATEGIC REVIEW

The charitable company presents its Report and Strategic Review.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The charitable company's aims and objectives are:

- the advancement of health and the relief of those in need by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage for the public benefit in particular, but not limited to the practice and provision of health, education, care or community services; and
- to provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.

Public Benefit Statement

Our main activities and who we try to benefit are described above.

Our charitable activities focus on care in the community, transport, dentistry, training, counselling services and operating a wellbeing centre.

All of our activities are undertaken to further our charitable purposes for the public benefit. In shaping our objectives and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit including the guidance 'Public Benefit: Running a Charity (PB2)'.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

In a climate of continuing financial challenges, demographic challenges of an ever increasing ageing population, social policy changes of how to look after an increasingly ageing population and political challenges in the transition to Brexit, Social Care in Action group of social enterprises (SCA) is continuing to flourish.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE (CONTINUED)

In October 2016, SCA celebrated its 25th Anniversary and held our AGM at Victoria Country Park in Southampton. We invited Rev. Brian Strevens, the founder of SCA, to share how the group began, how it grew from humble beginnings to the group it is today. Councillor Satvir Kaur from Southampton City Council spoke about the future of services and the important part that SCA plays in the community.

SCA is now two years into its five year strategy (published in 2016). We are on track to increase our growth and reach across Southern England.

We have restructured, reviewed and revised our systems, particularly in Care and Finance, enabling greater efficiencies and effectiveness in all we do.

The year to 31 March 2017 has seen SCA diversify with the merger into the SCA group of social enterprises of Options Wellbeing Trust, a charitable company specialising in counselling services particularly for gambling addictions. This diversification has increased our reach to Portsmouth, Oxfordshire and Milton Keynes.

SCA is also the lead partner in the Cobbett Road Hub and Library. We took over the running of the Library in June 2016, from Southampton City Council, ensuring the Library remains open. It is the only Library to house a drama company, Unexpected Places. We work closely with the community and Friends of Cobbett Road; and are represented on the Cobbett Road Hub and Library Advisory Group.

We were successful in receiving a grant from the Impact Readiness Fund. This enabled us to implement a new data programme, Sinzer, to evidence our impact and Social Return on Investment for our Reablement Service. This led to a contract with Southampton City Council to support people home from hospital and help them regain their strength to remain independent.

The work we have completed in this year puts the SCA group of social enterprises in a strong position to win future contracts and increase self-funded packages to enable individuals to maintain their independence, and maintain their health and wellbeing for longer, in their communities.

For a greater explanation and understanding of the detailed achievements and performance of the SCA group of social enterprises, reference should be made to the Reports and Financial Statements for the individual registered societies and charitable companies that comprise the SCA group of social enterprises.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Social Care in Action (Group)

These Financial Statements reflect the financial activity of Social Care in Action as a group of social enterprises and individually, whose activities are primarily training, employment enabling, advocacy and consultancy work. These consolidated Financial Statements for the S C A group of social enterprises reflect the combined income and expenditure of the businesses, its activities and impacts. The S C A group of social enterprises achieved a surplus of £1,188,615 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 restated - deficit of £(301,987)).

The group achieved an increase of income in the year ended 31 March 2017 with incoming resources of £8,791,241 compared to £7,897,631 in the previous year. Expenditure fell to £7,602,629, compared to £8,199,603 restated in the previous year. The group, however, achieved a surplus of £1,188,615 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 restated - deficit of £(301,987)).

The group now has a total reserve of £1,861,349 at 31 March 2017 compared to £672,734 at 31 March 2016.

The trustees are pleased with the surplus achieved for the year and the financial stability of the group.

Social Care in Action (Parent Company)

The charitable company's income decreased in the year to 31 March 2017 to £891,447, compared with £938,695 in the previous year.

Expenditure also decreased to £817,060 compared to £839,528 in the previous year.

This resulted in the charitable company achieving a surplus of £74,387, compared with £99,167 in the previous year.

The society has a total reserve of £183,406 at 31 March 2017 compared to £109,019 at 31 March 2016.

The trustees are pleased with the surplus achieved for the year and the financial stability of the charitable company.

The individual societies' and charitable companies' results can be summarised as follows:

S C A Care

The society, S C A Care, achieved a surplus of £13,843 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 restated deficit of £(483,098)). This society has a total reserve of £115,442 at 31 March 2017 compared to £101,599 (restated) at 31 March 2016.

S C A Fenwick 2 Limited

The society, S C A Fenwick 2 Limited, achieved a surplus of £21 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 - £2,766). The society has a total reserve of £4,998 at 31 March 2017 compared to £4,977 at 31 March 2016.

FINANCIAL REVIEW (CONTINUED)

S C A Trafalgar Dental Services

The society, S C A Trafalgar Dental Services, achieved a surplus of £57,313 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 - £76,343). The society has a total reserve of £357,826 at 31 March 2017 compared to £300,513 at 31 March 2016.

S C A Transport Services

The society, S C A Transport Services, achieved a surplus of £10,897 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 - £2,835). The society has a total reserve of £167,523 at 31 March 2017 compared to £156,626 at 31 March 2016.

Options Wellbeing Trust

The charitable company, Options Wellbeing Trust, achieved a surplus of £518,465 in the year to 31 March 2017 (2016 - deficit of £(52,005)). The charitable company has a total reserve of £1,032,154 at 31 March 2017 compared to £513,689 at 31 March 2016.

Principal Funding Sources

The principal funding sources for the individual charitable company are currently by way of training sales to S C A Care and S C A Trafalgar Dental Services. Social Care in Action was grateful for the grant from Big Society for Impact Readiness. These funds have been invaluable in securing contracts during the year within the group.

Investment Powers and Policy

The trustees do not consider it prudent, at this stage, to invest income for the longer term. The policy for investment is, therefore, to retain funds as cash and place them on bank deposit at the best rate obtainable.

Reserves Policy and Going Concern

It is the policy of the charitable company to aim towards maintaining unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charitable company, at a level where unrestricted funds will be sufficient to meet its outgoing expenses.

The trustees are considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds could be raised. The level of reserves is part of the charitable company's business planning, budgeting and forecasting process. It takes into account:

- risks associated with each stream of income and expenditure being different from that budgeted;
- planned activity levels; and
- organisational commitments.

The trustees are of the view that the charitable company and group are a going concern.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The Social Care in Action group of social enterprises (SCA) has many exciting plans and opportunities for the forthcoming year and beyond. These areas, in particular, are:

- Southampton Healthy Living 2017-2020

This will see the development of the Behaviour Changing contract for Southampton. SCA is the lead organisation programme managing a partnership approach delivered with Solent NHS Trust and Southampton Voluntary Services. A key element of this bid was to ensure that there is a bottom up and top down approach developed to enable individuals and communities to engage around stopping smoking, weight management, alcohol reduction and increase physical activity. The value of this contract is £1.1m per year.

Reablement 2017-2018

S C A Care were successful in demonstrating the impact and increased social return on investment for enabling individuals to be discharged from hospital and empowered to live with support in their own homes. This resulted in a contract to the value of £200,000.

Extra Care 2017-2021

S C A Care successfully bid for a contract to deliver Extra Care support to individuals in the New Forest at Lymington, New Milton and Totton. This is worth £700,000 per year for the next four years.

Older Persons Offer

Southampton City Council will be tendering their Older Persons Offer. SCA are developing a consortium to bid to develop an innovative approach for this service which will replace the day care and transport service element supporting day care centres.

In the longer term SCA, in line with its strategic document produced for 2016-2021, are half way through the time period and have successfully grown and diversified, increasing the sustainability and social enterprise supporting people in their communities.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The company is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 5 September 2002 and registered as a charity on 8 April 2003. The charitable company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objectives and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association.

In the event of the charitable company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and, under the charitable company's Articles, are known as members of the Board. The directors are reappointed in accordance with the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Trustee Induction and Training

A programme is employed for the induction of new trustees. This includes visiting the offices, meeting staff and observing how the charitable company operates. It also encompasses a full induction in the charitable company's policies and procedures and involves examining the business plan.

Updates on the responsibilities of the trustees are provided as appropriate to developments in statute and best practice.

Organisational Structure

Social Care in Action has a Board which meets at least four times a year and which is responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charitable company.

At present the Board comes from a variety of professional backgrounds relevant to the work of the charitable company.

Day to day operations and responsibilities are delegated to the Senior Management Team, who are responsible for ensuring the charitable company delivers the services specified, meets key performance targets and stays within the agreed budgets.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (CONTINUED)

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT (CONTINUED)

Risk Management

The trustees have conducted a review of the major risks to which the charitable company is exposed. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks the charitable company faces. Significant external risks have led to the development of a strategic plan. Internal control risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions and projects.

Related Parties

Social Care in Action is a member of the S C A group of social enterprises. The other members of the group, who are all Registered Societies under the Co-operative and Community Benefit Societies Act 2014, are S C A Care, S C A Transport Services, S C A Trafalgar Dental Services and S C A Fenwick 2 Limited, along with Options Wellbeing Trust and Southampton Healthy Living, who are companies Limited by Guarantee and Registered Charities.

The charitable companies and registered societies are all operated and managed on a unified basis with Social Care in Action acting as the parent body.

Key Management and Personnel Remuneration

The directors consider the board of directors, who are the charitable company's trustees and the senior management team, comprise the key management personnel of the charitable company in charge of directing and controlling, running and operating the charitable company on a day to day basis. All directors give their time freely as trustees in the year.

Pay Policy for Senior Staff

The trustees review the remuneration of senior staff periodically on the basis of the performance of the individual concerned and the charitable company and group as a whole.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES

The trustees (who are also directors of Social Care in Action for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the annual Report of the Trustees and the Financial Statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTEES (CONTINUED)

Company law requires the trustees to prepare Financial Statements for each financial year. Under company law the trustees must not approve the Financial Statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these Financial Statements the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP (FRS 102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the Financial Statements; and
- prepare the Financial Statements on the going concern basis, unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy, at any time, the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The trustees are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the charitable company's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of the Financial Statements may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Statement as to Disclosure to our Auditors

In so far as the trustees are aware, at the time of approving our Report of the Trustees:

- there is no relevant information, being information needed by the auditor in connection with preparing their report, of which the charitable company's and group's auditor is unaware; and
- the trustees, having made enquiries of fellow directors and the group's auditor that they ought to have individually taken, have each taken all steps that he/she is obliged to take as a director in order to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the charitable company's and group's auditor is aware of that information.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Charity Information

Social Care in Action is a charitable company established under its Memorandum and Articles of Association and registered with the Charity Commission and Companies House in England and Wales.

The principal address is Amplevine House, Dukes Road, Southampton, SO14 0ST.

The charitable company is a public benefit company.

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the Financial Statements are as follows:

(a) Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their Financial Statements in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

The Financial Statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charitable company. Monetary amounts are rounded to the nearest £.

Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note.

(b) Reconciliation with Previous Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

In preparing the Financial Statements the trustees have considered whether, in applying the accounting policies required by FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102, the restatement of comparative items was required at 1 April 2014. The transition to FRS 102 has resulted in no change to the charitable company's net income/expenditure or net assets.

(c) Group Financial Statements

The consolidated Financial Statements incorporate the results of Social Care in Action and its related Registered Societies and charitable companies.

The consolidated entity is referred to as the S C A group of social enterprises (group).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(d) Income

All income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charitable company is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Donations and legacies are received by way of donations and are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.
- Income from charitable activities is accounted for when earned.
- Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance, are recognised when the charitable company becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charitable company where this can been quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these Financial Statements.

(e) Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Expenditure on charitable activities comprises those costs incurred by the charitable company in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the Statement of Financial Activities on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis, eg floor areas, per capita or estimated usage as set out in Note 6.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charitable company and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charitable company.

(f) Goodwill

Goodwill is calculated as the difference between the acquisition cost and the fair value of an asset. Goodwill is written-off as follows:

(g) Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. The costs of minor additions are not capitalized.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life as follows:

Buses and motor vehicles	2 to 6 years
Office equipment	2 to 7 years
Computer equipment	3 to 4 years
Training equipment	4 years
Furniture, fixtures and fittings	3 to 4 years
Freehold buildings and property	50 years
Property improvements	5 to 15 years
Dental equipment	7 years

(h) Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

(i) Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

(i) Cash at Bank and in Hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

(k) Creditors and Provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charitable company has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

(1) Hire Purchase

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalized and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(m) Finance Lease Agreements

Assets held under finance leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership accrue to the lessee, are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term or their useful economic life. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability. The total finance charge for each lease is charged against surplus so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge for each accounting period.

(n) Operating Lease Agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against surplus as incurred.

(o) Pension Costs

The related society, S C A Care, and the related charitable company, Options Wellbeing Trust, both participate in the Hampshire County Council pension scheme which is a Defined Benefit Pension Scheme within a multi-employer plan.

Sufficient information is not available to measure the net defined liability for the obligations under the defined benefit plan and, therefore, the registered society and charitable company has accounted for the plan in the year to 31 March 2017 as if it were a defined contribution plan.

The registered society and the charitable company have entered into an agreement with the multi-employer plan provider that determines how the deficit is to be funded and this has been recognised as a liability in the consolidated Financial Statements.

(p) Taxation

The activities of the charitable company and its related societies and charitable companies, with the exception of S C A Fenwick 2 Limited, are exempt from Corporation Tax on their charitable activities.

(q) Government Grants

Grants that relate to specific expenditure are treated as deferred income, which is then credited to the Consolidated Statement of Financial Activities over the related assets' useful life. Other grants are credited to income when received.

(r) Donated Services

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charitable company where this can be quantified.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(s) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds consist of the general purposes fund and designated funds.

Designated funds are funds established by the trustees from time to time for specific projects or purposes, are not in any way restricted and any surplus or deficit will be transferred to/from the general purposes fund when the designated fund is closed.

Restricted Funds are funds subject to specific restrictions imposed by donors or by the purpose of the appeal.

(t) Significant Judgements and Estimates

Preparation of the Financial Statements may require management to make significant judgements and estimates. There are no items in the Financial Statements where judgements and estimates would have a significant effect on amounts recognised in the Financial Statements.

(u) Financial Instruments

The charitable company only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans, which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

During the year ended 31 March 2008, S C A Care received a grant of £850,000 from Hampshire Primary Care Trust. This grant was used to purchase The Fenwick Hospital, Pikes Hill, Lyndhurst for £850,000. No cost has been included in Freehold Land & Property as the grant received has been offset against the capital cost of The Fenwick Hospital.

Hampshire Primary Care Trust has taken a legal charge on The Fenwick Hospital. The legal charge provides that the full market value (at the time of disposal) from any future disposal of the property is returned to Hampshire Primary Care Trust. S C A Care granted a five year lease to S C A Fenwick 2 Limited on the property, which expired in March 2013.

S C A Fenwick 2 Limited will continue, under licence, to occupy the property on the same terms as the expired lease.

Options Wellbeing Trust owned four properties at the date of merger with Social Care in Action. Three properties in Southampton, Basingstoke and Eastleigh are included at the estimated fair value. The properties at Basingstoke and Eastleigh were valued by Vail Williams (chartered surveyors), whilst the property in Southampton was valued by the trustees based on relevant market information. These revaluations took place before the merger date.

All three properties are unencumbered, with the exception of the property in Southampton where Southampton City Council has a legal charge over the property representing a 20% interest in the property. The property's revaluation included in the group Financial Statements incorporates 80% of the total value of the property.

The fourth property in Lymington was disposed of after the merger with a gain being recorded of £83,922.

Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted Funds comprise those funds which trustees are free to use in accordance with the Charitable Company's charitable objects.

The Revaluation Reserve relates to freehold property revaluations which arose in Options Wellbeing Trusts Financial Statements before its merger with Social Care in Action on 31 May 2016.

Restricted Funds

Restricted Funds are funds which have been given for particular purposes and projects. The Restricted Funds must be used for the specific purpose as laid down by the donor.

Impact Readiness Fund - Social Care in Action has received a grant of £43,596 from the Big Lottery/Cogent Ventures to prepare for and implement a tool for measuring the benefits and impact on society when delivering its services to the community.

Hardship Fund - Social Care in Action has received funds to provide services to the community during the Christmas period.

Mildred Anne Reynolds Fund - Social Care in Action received a gift of £5,000 to fund the introduction of new activities to the health and wellbeing centre operated by S C A Fenwick 2 Limited.

25. PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT

S C A Care operates a defined benefit pension scheme within a multi-employer plan, operated by Hampshire County Council. Sufficient information is not available to measure the net defined liability of its obligation under the defined benefit plan.

S C A Care has, during the year, entered into a commitment to fund the deficit by way of contributions calculated by Hampshire County Council, with effect from 1 April 2015.

The commitment arising on that date was £466,641. This commitment has been incorporated as a prior year adjustment in the 31 March 2016 comparative figures, leading to 2016 being restated in these Financial Statements.

27. PENSION COSTS

S C A Care operates a defined benefit pension scheme within a multi-employer plan, operated by Hampshire County Council. Sufficient information is not available to measure the net defined liability for its obligation under the defined benefit plan. S C A Care has, therefore, accounted for the pension as if it was a defined contribution scheme.

S C A Care has, during the year, entered into a commitment to find the deficit by way of contributions over the next 20 years. The commitment arising of £466,641, calculated at 1 April 2015, has been incorporated as a prior year adjustment with the 31 March 2016 figures being restated as a result.

Options Wellbeing Trust participates in the Hampshire County Council pension scheme, which is a multi-employer defined benefit scheme.

Options Wellbeing Trust contributes to their scheme for one current employee.

Sufficient information is not available to measure the net defined liability for its obligations under the defined benefit pension scheme.

In the year to 31 March 2017, Options Wellbeing Trust entered into a commitment to fund a deficit on this pension scheme by way of contributions calculated by Hampshire County Council. The commitment entered into was £109,137 over a 25 year period.

At 31 March 2017 the commitment outstanding was £107,174.

The potential liability arising on the pension scheme will not crystallize whilst there is at least one contributing member to the pension scheme but will crystallize if Options Wellbeing Trust decides to leave the pension scheme permanently.

36. ULTIMATE CONTROL

Social Care in Action is a member of the S C A group of social enterprises. The other members of the S C A group of social enterprises are S C A Care, S C A Transport Services, S C A Trafalgar Dental Services, S C A Fenwick 2 Limited, Options Wellbeing Trust and Southampton Healthy Living. All charitable companies and registered societies of the S C A group of social enterprises are operated and managed on a unified basis.

Social Care in Action is deemed to ultimately be the parent body of the S C A group of social enterprises as the charitable company can exercise dominant influence over the Registered Societies and charitable companies within the S C A group of social enterprises.
